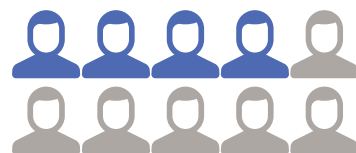
No matter where you live in the US, a natural disaster—hurricane, tornado, wildfire, earthquake, flood—can strike. That's why we need to be prepared now.
